KALINGA INSTITUTE OF SOCIAL SCIENCES (KISS)



9% of India's population is tribal. Despite the constitutional promise of social justice, the tribal population in India lives in deplorable conditions in the dense forests and remote hinterlands. In Odisha, over 22.8 percent of the population is tribal and live in utmost poverty with low literacy rates, rampant child marriage and superstition, and limited access to school and healthcare facilities. Poor infrastructure, teacher absenteeism, lack of toilets, and pressure to handle siblings bedevil the education system in tribal areas in India and Odisha.

In such a scenario, Dr Achyuta Samanta came up with a revolutionary initiative with his strong passion & commitment, called Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), aiming to empower tribal communities through education. It comprises a not-for-profit foundation, school and college and a university. Right from his poverty-stricken childhood to his struggle-filled youth, he has worked towards arresting poverty & hunger, the two social ills that he faced from the age of five to twenty. In 1992-93, India was just starting to integrate with the global economy and progress in education was missing in Odisha, let alone education for tribal children. It was a grey area where the Government chose not to intervene and private organizations could not muster up the courage to create waves of change.

It was at that time, with limited or no finances, KISS was founded by Dr Achyuta Samanta with a belief that education can empower the people. It was not an easy start and he had to overcome several setbacks. The first ten years were extremely difficult. The common man considered KISS' initiative as an intrusion. However, he continued overcoming all adversities and the rest is history. His thought process was very clear and based on two important pillars -

- Procedural: Free education from KG to PG and beyond in a fully residential campus
- Substantive: A unique financial model for the sustainable functioning of KISS, contributed by the stakeholders of Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT), another self-financing educational institution founded by him.

KISS started with 125 poor indigenous students in 1992-93 and has now grown in scale and scope, catering to 80,000 indigenous children. Of these, 30,000 students study at the main campus in Bhubaneswar, 40,000 are alumni and 10,000 study at 10 satellite centres of KISS across Odisha, all free of cost. It's higher education wing, KISS Deemed to be University is the world's first and only university exclusively for tribals. It has indirectly impacted over eight million tribal children and youth. The students come from 62 different tribal groups within the region, of which 13 are Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs). In its course of inception, evolution and existence, KISS has been promoting quality, holistic education, girl child empowerment, vocational and life skill education, healthcare, scientific temper and humanism and sustainable development. It has arrested naxalism, hunger and malnutrition, child labour and trafficking, early girl child marriage and dropout to a large extent. The contribution of KISS in the field of sports is immense. KISS has groomed around 5000 sportspersons who have participated and excelled in prestigious national and international events.

Since 2015, KISS has been accorded Special Consultative Status by UN ECOSOC. It is associated with UNDPI and has worked in close collaboration with many agencies of the UN including UN Women, UNFPA, WFP, UNDP, UN Volunteers, UNICEF and other international organizations to implement the common objectives. KISS is the recipient of UNESCO International Literacy Prize 2022 and Green Gown International Awards. KISS proudly adheres to a 3E approach - Educate, Enable, Empower while ensuring that the model prioritizes indigenous control of education, to preserve the culture, heritage and traditions of India's diverse tribal communities and fulfill the Sustainable Development Goals 2030 in its entirety. The institution aims to reach over 2 million directly in the next decade with a dedicated vision of 'no child should be deprived of education because of poverty'.



KISS HUMANITARIAN AWARD

The KISS Humanitarian Award is a prestigious annual international award conferred by the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) in Bhubaneswar, India, conceptualized and the brainchild of visionary humanitarian and educationist Prof. Achyuta Samanta, Founder of KIIT and KISS. The award was initiated in 2008 to recognize and felicitate individuals for their exemplary and distinguished service to humanity across the globe. KISS is one of the greatest humanitarian works going on for the last 32 years and it recognizes individuals who do similar work on a large scale to inspire others. The award consists of a citation scroll and a gold-plated trophy that depicts a great social message given in a public function at KISS. The gold-plated trophy embodies a golden heart of a humanitarian with the virtues of purity, kindness, prosperity, and hope. It features a pair of hands uplifting a heart, which is textured with shapes resembling waving hands that symbolize how a pair of dedicated hands can make a significant difference in the lives of the helpless and make world a better place to live in. The award has attracted the attention of both domestic and international media and has attained much covetousness over the years.

GENESIS OF KISS HUMANITARIAN AWARD

The KISS Humanitarian Award was conceived by Dr. Achyuta Samanta, the founder of Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS). He was born into poverty and the loss of his father at a tender age of four plunged Dr. Samanta and his family, his widowed mother and seven siblings, into deep hardship and deprivation. His early years were a relentless struggle for survival. The family frequently endured days without a single square meal. From the age of five until now, he survived and achieved success due to the humanitarian attitude of people who sympathised with his condition. He understood how compassion and humanitarian treatment could provide respite from deprivation. This experience ingrained in him the importance of humanitarian values and inspired his lifelong commitment to helping others. His life embodies the essence of humanitarianism.

Dr. Samanta believes that humanitarian work, being carried out across the globe, deserves recognition and gratitude. He constituted the KISS Humanitarian Award to honour individuals making significant contributions to humanitarian efforts, making the world a better place by alleviating suffering and promoting peace and happiness. What is particularly beautiful about this award is that it comes from KISS, one of the largest humanitarian projects in the world.

To shortlist and finalise recipients for this award, the institute has formed a search committee. The objective of the search committee is to identify individuals from the submitted applications who have demonstrated excellence in humanitarian work. These individuals come from various fields, including social service, policymaking, philanthropy, sports, education, women's rights, among others. However, the primary focus is on their humanitarian work and their concern for the well-being of humanity.

The award, regardless of caste, creed, race, place of birth, or gender recognises those who not only feel the pain of others but also take action and step forward to confront adversity, offer hope, and provide assistance to those in need. Despite the challenges and dangers associated with humanitarian work, they remain committed to overcoming these obstacles and make this world a better place. Through this award, KISS continues to celebrate and encourage the humanitarian spirit, inspiring future generations to uphold these vital principles of compassion, humanitarianism, and selfless service.

ELIGIBILITY AND NOMINATION PROCESS

The KISS Humanitarian Award honors individuals, teams, or organizations making significant contributions to humanitarian efforts. The nomination process is designed to recognize those who have demonstrated a substantial impact in the field of humanitarianism or related human rights work.

Eligibility

Open to Individuals, teams, or organizations with a track record of significant impact in humanitarianism or related human rights work.

Nominators

The KISS Humanitarian Award is overseen by an independent international panel responsible for selecting the laureates. Nominations for the KISS Humanitarian Award may be submitted by any qualified individuals.

A nomination for the KISS Humanitarian Award is only considered valid if submitted by a person who meets specific criteria. According to the guidelines of the KISS Foundation, a nomination is considered valid if it is submitted by a person who falls within one of the following categories. Personal applications for the award will not be considered:

- Members of national assemblies and national governments (cabinet members/ministers) of sovereign states as well as current heads of state.
- United Nations bodies (e.g., UNHCR, WHO, UNICEF, UNFPA, UNEP, UN Women).
- International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC).
- University professors, professors emeriti and associate professors of history, social sciences, law, philosophy, theology, and religion; university rectors and university directors (or their equivalents); directors of peace research institutes and foreign policy institutes.
- Indian representatives in UN committees/agencies.
- Humanitarian organizations.
- NGOs working in humanitarian fields and human rights.
- Previous winners of the award.

The nominator should have direct knowledge of the nominated individual or organization's work. The nominator may not be an officer or employee, or any individual receiving remuneration for his or her services from the nominated organization. Board members may nominate providing they receive no payment for their service. The nominator may not be a family member of an officer or employee of the nominated organization. The nominator may not be the founder of the nominated organization. The nominator must submit a signed nomination letter in English through the nominations portal.

Evaluation Considerations

The following are considered when evaluating the work of the nominee:

- Extraordinary contributions toward alleviating human suffering.
- Significance of the issue(s) the organization is addressing.
- Established record of achievement in significantly contributing to solutions.
- Demonstration of a compelling programmatic approach to make a lasting impact.
- Organizational capacity and administrative efficiency to address the issue(s) at hand.
- Prioritization of diversity, equity, and inclusion in strategies, programs, and operations.
- Demonstration of effective partnerships to leverage further impact.
- Prioritization of evaluating programmatic approach for continual improvement.
- Impact the award would have on the organization and the issue(s) on which the organization focuses.

Evaluation Considerations

- Step 1** Nominator nominates an individual, team, or organization by completing the nomination form and uploading a signed nomination letter on the KISS Humanitarian Award nominations portal.
- Step 2** The Foundation notifies the nominee of their nomination through email with a request to submit additional information online.
- Step 3** Nominee completes Phase 1 application. The nominee will have approximately five business days to complete and submit their application through our online portal.
- Step 4** Application review. After the nominee submits their application, it undergoes an internal review process.
- Step 5** Select nominees invited to complete Phase 2 application. Select nominees will be notified via email to submit additional information through the online portal. The nominee will have approximately ten business days to complete and submit their second application through our online portal.
- Step 6** Finalists selected. After the nominee submits their second application, it undergoes an internal review process leading to a shortlist of finalists.

Please note: Due to the volume of nominations received, if at any point in the process we identify that a nominee does not meet the eligibility requirements, the nominee will be removed from consideration without notice. Through this detailed procedure, KISS ensures that the process for applying and selecting recipients of the Humanitarian Award is thorough, transparent, and upholds the highest standards of humanitarian principles.

Jury composition and selection:

- A three-member KISS Humanitarian Award Committee, headed by the Founder, will be constituted. This committee will nominate a seven-member jury consisting of prominent national and international figures.
- The seven-member jury will submit three names to the KISS Humanitarian Award Committee. From these three names, the committee will consider two candidates based on availability and merit. After due diligence, one/two individual will be finalized for the KISS Humanitarian Award for the current year.

Timeline:

- **Call for Proposal Start:** January 1
- **Proposal Deadline:** March 31
- **Committee Review:** By April 30
- **Board Report Submission:** By May 30
- **Jury to Advise:** June 30
- **Announcement:** July 31
- **KISS Humanitarian Award Ceremony:** December 10 (Human Rights Day)

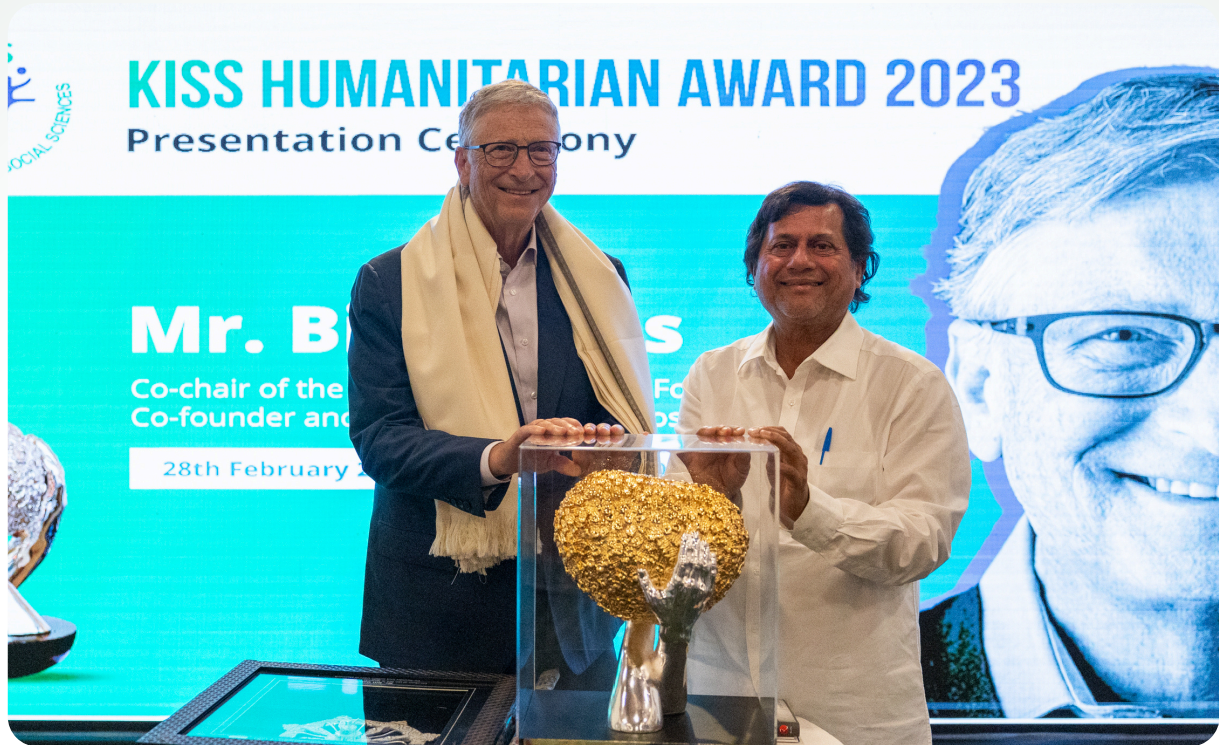


Her Excellency Mama Rachel Ruto E.G.H.

PERSON BEHIND THE AWARD

Dr Achyuta Samanta



Dr Achyuta Samanta is an educationist, philanthropist and social worker. He is the founder of an international philanthropic marvel, the Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS), home to 80,000 indigenous and tribal children from all over the state of Odisha. These children are provided free education, food and accommodation, sports and vocational training in a sprawling campus that has state-of-the-art facilities. Dr Samanta is also the founder of Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT), one of the most prominent global universities, renowned for its excellence in professional education. Besides education, tribal uplift, healthcare and rural development, Dr Samanta has contributed immensely to promoting Odisha's art, culture, literature, film industry, media and sports. He has undertaken a mission of national integration by helping society develop. He converted his birthplace, a remote village called Kalarabanka, into perhaps Asia's first Smart Village. He has been conferred with more than 50 international and national awards and over 200 state awards besides two highest civilian awards from the Royal Kingdom of Bahrain and Mongolia. Dr Samanta has traveled to 60 countries to represent India and his institutions. He has been awarded 60 honorary doctorates before turning 60. In addition, KIIT and KISS have been bestowed the Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puruskar 2022, UNESCO Literacy Prize 2022, Green Gown Awards and appreciation from UNECOSOC. He has lent this face value to build the brand of KIIT and KISS. Dr Samanta is a former Member of Parliament (Lok Sabha) from Kandhamal, Odisha. He has been propagating the Art of Giving as a way of life, which is aimed at bringing peace and happiness around the globe. Despite all his achievements, he has a very simple lifestyle, and works tirelessly to achieve zero poverty, zero hunger, zero illiteracy. He has made it his mission to spread humanity and compassion and the institutions he represents embrace compassion as the true hallmark of greatness. He leads a simple life dedicated to the growth of KIIT and KISS. Despite giving so much to these institutions, he has nothing formally to his name or in the name of any member of his family at KIIT and KISS. His complete surrender to God to lead him has made him take decisions that have changed the course of history for educational institutions and made Odisha a prominent name in the education map of India. The saga of Dr Samanta finds its epilogue in his enduring legacy as he continues to script new chapters of change, thereby leaving an indelible imprint on the sands of time.

Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT), a household name in the education sector, has become a sought-after destination in India for professional studies. The campus houses a 2600-bedded super speciality hospital, KIMS, a multi-storey central library, a central research facility, a 22-storey research and innovation wing, auditoriums - the largest one with 5000 seating capacity, 18 sports complexes, many international standard stadiums covering all sports, 30 food courts, and a rose garden. The institution takes pride in being the greenest campus in India.



It has received all accreditations and affiliations from prestigious national and international bodies such as the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET), USA and the Institution of Engineering and Technology, (IET), UK because of its quality research, innovation, and publications and citations. KIIT has had an excellent placement record since its inception owing to its quality teaching and learning process, and the brand value that it carries. KIIT is ranked in the cohort of 601-800 in the Times Higher Education 'World University Ranking' for 2024 and declared as the sixth best university in India, among Government and Private. Its Computer Science Engineering ranks in the cohort of 301-400 and its overall Engineering ranking is 401-500 in the world. KIIT has been accredited with an A++ grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with an all-India 16th rank by the National Institution of Ranking Framework, NIRF, Ministry of Education. It has also been the top university for innovation among private institutions for two consecutive years (2020, 2021) according to AICTE, Government of India. It has been ranked among the top 151-200 universities in the world as per the Times Higher Education Young University Ranking 2024.

KIIT has made colossal contributions to Sports. Currently, 24 Olympians pursue their education at KIIT and 12 are participating in the Paris Olympics 2024, including. The University has been conferred the Sportstar Award, FICCI India Sports Award for the promotion of sports and CII Sports Business Award 2023 for best Sports Facility. KIIT and KISS are the nodal centres for the FIFA Football For Schools Programme in Asia. KIIT has been chosen for the Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puruskar 2022 for encouraging sports through Corporate Social Responsibility. Four students of KIIT have bagged 2 Gold medals and 2 Silver Medals at Asian Games 2022 in China. Besides its immense contribution to the development of the state and the city, KIIT has also promoted local art, culture, sculpture, rural development, literature and spiritualism. KIMS is renowned for its state-of-the-art infrastructure and its attached 2600-bed multi-speciality hospital, which includes a 300-bed Super Speciality Hospital, a 300-bed Cancer Care Centre, and a 1600-bed General Hospital that serves economically disadvantaged sections of society. KIMS has built a strong reputation for research, innovative treatments, and healthcare solutions. It has attracted renowned physicians and doctors from around the world. The institute is an empanelled hospital for several healthcare schemes and features a NABL-accredited central laboratory and a state-of-the-art blood bank. In addition to its medical services, KIMS offers routine health check-ups, 24x7 ambulance services, and continuous medical counter availability. It conducts healthcare camps in rural areas across Odisha, providing free medical services to the poor. KIMS also has 10 satellite centers in different districts, with plans to establish ten more 200-bedded hospitals in the future. KIMS reflects Dr. Samanta's commitment to serving society with quality healthcare, inspired by his own experiences of healthcare challenges in his childhood.

Each school is self-contained with smart, air-conditioned classrooms, advanced laboratories, and dedicated facilities such as libraries, food courts, amphitheatres, and seminar halls. The campuses are fully WiFi-enabled, eco-friendly, and equipped with modern technology.

As residential universities, KIIT and KISS offer top-notch hostel facilities, with over 60 hostels providing separate dining halls, recreation facilities, with mentors ensuring a home-away-from-home experience for students. The campus has an in-house 2,600-bedded super-specialty hospital called Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS). It has also been recognised as the top university in the world for its efforts in reducing inequalities by Times Higher Education Impact Rankings 2024. It is a first for any university in India and KIIT and KISS, two sister institutions have unique recognition of being accorded with the special status. It is the only private university in South Asia to have such a tie-up. A historic collaboration with the American Council of Young Political Leaders (ACYPL) has also been established, fostering international diplomacy and leadership exchange programs.

KIIT and KISS have hosted 22 Nobel laureates, representatives from all UN agencies and universities, as well as ambassadors and high commissioners from 90 countries. Besides education as a primary focus, both universities have made significant contributions to art, culture, film, media, literature, sports, rural development, women empowerment, and spiritualism. KISS has been awarded the UNESCO Literacy Prize 2022 for its contribution to indigenous education. The Technology Business Incubator at KIIT has revolutionised the startup landscape, significantly contributing to the state's economic growth. The presence of KIIT and KISS has transformed Bhubaneswar into the education capital of Odisha. Policymakers, educationists, academicians, jurists, and celebrities visit the campuses throughout the year, contributing to their thriving environment, especially through MICE (Meetings, Incentives, Conferences, and Exhibitions) events.

A university is known by how it breathes life into its bricks and mortar, how it empowers human resources, and how it inspires other universities and institutions. In this true sense, KIIT and KISS are unique and are propelling India, fostering innovation, excellence, and social progress.
