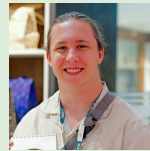

**June 25-** Arrive in Seattle, tour the Indian Consulate, Indian lunch at Clove, visit a Hindu Temple, board flight for India

**June 27 -** Arrive in India, walk through Lodi Gardens, visit the Red Fort, and dinner with the Ministry of External Affairs

**June 28-** Visit to Akshaya Patra Foundation Kitchen and ISKCON Vrindavan Temple, trip to Agra and Taj Mahal

**June 29-** Fly to Bhubaneswar, tour of KIIT and KISS University and school, tour of Falcon Shrimp Processing Plant, Dinner with host Dwiti Vikramaditya

**June 30-** Campus programming including a Language Lab, meeting with the Hon'ble Founder of KIIT and KIIS, Dr Samanta, pampered at Looks Salon, dinner at Odraa to experience reimagined traditional dishes of the region

**July 1-** Yoga in the Rose Garden, visit to Nandankanan Zoo, Wildlife Sanctuary, and Botanical Gardens, Vocational Arts Lab, Engage with students, and sports demonstrations
